- Meso = Mesopotamia
- Hittites fall & Egypt decline after 1177 left Canaan open for Hebrews & Philistines. Neo-Babylonian Empire (conquered by Cyrus in 539);
- Ramses II (1279-1213) was pharaoh at time of Exodus of Jews from Egypt. Ramses III defeated Sea Peoples in 1177, but decline of Egypt thereafter. Egypt conquered by Cambyses II (Persian Achaemenid) in 525 BC.
- Hebrew includes Saul (1025-1007), David, King Solomon, Divided Kingdom, and Judah Alone. Assyrians conquer North in 722. Babylon Exile ended in 539.
- Persian Empires (3200 BC to 651 AD) includes Achaemenid founded by Cyrus the Great in 539; Cyrus gave permission for the Jews to return to Jerusalem in 538 BC. Behistun Inscription (near Kermanshah) authored by Darius I (r. 522-486) attributes success to Ahura Mazda, "Lord of Wisdom." In fulfillment of Daniel's prophecy, Artaxerxes I issued edict regarding restoration of Jewish temple in 465 BC (2300 years before 1844).
- Greek civilization became a Roman province in 146 BC; With collapse of Bronze Age in about 1200, Minoan civilization ended and the Dark Ages began.
- Roman Republic arose before Alexander the Great; Julius Caesar was dictator 49 to 44 BC. The Empire began with Augustus (27 BC to 14 AD).
- Chinese civilization: name of dynasty (# of polities): Xia (3000); Shang (1800); W. Zhou (170); E. Zhou (23) from 770-476 and (7) from 476-221; Qin (1); [Fukuyama Origins, p. 98] Warring States Period was from 403-221 BC.
- People: Confucius (551-479), Lao Tzu (570-500), and Socrates (469-399) are concurrent with the Buddha (563-483);
- Estimated dates of Moses Revelation: 1250 BC & Zoroastrian Revelation: 1200 BC; Buddha lived from 563-483 BC; Dates for Krishna not known;
- Wars include Greek-Persian Wars (490 to 448 BC), Alexander's Conquests, (334-323 BC), Peloponnesian Wars (431-404 BC), Servile Wars (135-71 BC), Mithradratic Wars (88-63 BC), First Roman Civil War (49-47 BC), and Second Roman Civil War (33-31 BC);
